The Ten Visions of Zechariah

Zechariah Chapter 1-6

A Spring ENGAGE Group Overview

Big Picture

Zechariah's visions were given to God's people after they returned from exile. Jerusalem was weak. The temple was unfinished. Morale was low.

These ten visions come in one night and answer a huge question the people were asking:

"Is God still with us—and does our future still matter?"

Short answer: **Yes. God sees. God acts. God restores.**

Here are the 10 vision we will be looking at:

Vision 1 – The Horsemen Among the Myrtle Trees

Zechariah 1:7–17

What Zechariah sees:

Riders report that the whole earth is at rest—while Jerusalem is still broken.

Meaning:

God sees the injustice. Silence does not mean absence. Judgment and restoration are coming.

Key Truth:

God is not unaware of your waiting season.

Vision 2 – The Four Horns and Four Craftsmen

Zechariah 1:18–21

What Zechariah sees:

Four horns (oppressors) are destroyed by four craftsmen.

Meaning:

Every power that oppresses God's people has an expiration date.

Key Truth:

God raises deliverers for every enemy.

Vision 3 – The Man With the Measuring Line

Zechariah 2

What Zechariah sees:

Jerusalem being measured—then told it won't need walls.

Meaning:

God's future for His people is bigger than what they can contain or control.

Key Truth:

God's presence is better than human protection.

Vision 4 – Clean Garments for the High Priest

Zechariah 3

What Zechariah sees:

Joshua the high priest stands accused, then receives clean clothes.

Meaning:

God removes guilt and restores identity.

Key Truth:

God doesn't just forgive—He re-commissions.

Vision 5 – The Gold Lampstand and Two Olive Trees

Zechariah 4

What Zechariah sees:

A lampstand continually supplied with oil.

Meaning:

God's work is accomplished by His Spirit, not human strength.

Key Verse:

“Not by might, nor by power, but by My Spirit.”

Vision 6 – The Flying Scroll

Zechariah 5:1–4

What Zechariah sees:

A massive scroll flying across the land, bringing judgment.

Meaning:

God takes sin seriously—especially hidden or unrepentant sin.

Key Truth:

God's grace never cancels His holiness.

Vision 7 – The Woman in the Basket

Zechariah 5:5–11

What Zechariah sees:

Wickedness removed and relocated.

Meaning:

God doesn't manage sin—He removes it.

Key Truth:

True restoration requires removal, not relocation.

Vision 8 – The Four Chariots

Zechariah 6:1–8

What Zechariah sees:

Chariots sent to patrol the earth.

Meaning:

God rules over all nations, not just Israel.

Key Truth:

God's authority is global, not local.

Vision 9 – The Crowning of Joshua

Zechariah 6:9–15

What Zechariah sees:

The high priest crowned like a king.

Meaning:

A future Priest-King is coming—both mediator and ruler.

Key Truth:

God unites spiritual leadership and righteous authority.

Vision 10 – The Branch (The Coming Messiah)

Zechariah 6:12–13

What Zechariah hears:

A prophecy about “The Branch” who will build the temple and reign.

Meaning:

This points forward to Jesus—our Priest, King, and Restorer.

Key Truth:

God’s ultimate restoration comes through Christ.
